APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Laura moved that the July meeting minutes be approved; Debi seconded. Minutes approved, with minor typo correction on page 2.

Sam clarified that there had been no specific incident, but just a general climate of unease for international students.

OLD BUSINESS

- Safety Recognition and Awards the Qualtrics form is finished and ready to be posted.
- Policy Review Dan has met with Chris Viggiani, Policy and Standards Program
 Director. The overarching safety policy is at the Research Office for their review. The
 committee should be able to begin reviewing policies in the next three months or so.
- Safety walks are due at the end of August. Kay provided information on which routes have been completed so far.

REVIEW OF ACCIDENT REPORTS

Hannah Glaspell, EHS student intern, has been working on Near Miss reporting. Currently, near misses are recorded in the HR Advocate Incident Reporting form, and Heidi is able to pull reports. Hannah has put together training and posters and a web form for reporting. Hannah will be invited to an upcoming meeting to present the program.

The incident involving an inhaled solvent occurred because the experiment was too big to be conducted in a fume hood and the tube providing venting to the hood failed.

There was a short discussion stemming from a squirrel bite incident. There are several agencies that may need to be notified in case of animal bites, including the Department of Public Safety,

Oregon State Police, local Animal Control, Chintimini Wildlife Center, Fisheries and Wildlife.

FIRE SAFETY INSPECTIONS UPDATE

FACILITIES MONTHLY LIFE/SAFETY WORK ORDERS

- An odor at Furman Hall was resolved by pouring water into a dry drain.
- Eyewash stations were repaired at Nash and Magruder.
- Emergency showers have been fixed in Gilbert and Wilkinson.

EH&S ON-CALL LOG/REPORT OF UNSAFE CONDITIONS

- Most reports involved odors, many of them stemming from roofing at Magruder Hall.
 Building Managers should be reminded to inform building occupants about planned building work; supervisors may arrange alternative locations to work when possible.
- The HR Advocate form should be used to report indoor air quality issues, along with reporting to Facilities Services and/or EH&S.
- Work at Burt Hall is being done on weekends to reduce exposures, but researchers often work on weekends.
- There was a chemical spill in the Linus Pauling Building.
- There were reports of water and air quality problems at Ag & Life Sciences
