APPROVAL OF MINUTES

NEW BUSINESS

Kay reported that she has added materials to the UHSC box. A folder was created titled UHSC Member Materials that contains resources and training materials. This will serve as a new member

handbook and is available to all UHSC members.

Kay provided safety training data for the past five years. Since 2014, safety training numbers have increased dramatically, mostly due to hard work by EH&S individuals in an attempt to identify lab workers, assign them training, and sending reminders to workers of training due. Overall, annual safety training numbers are up 195%. Trainings for laboratory safety are up 324%; hazardous waste is up 1170%; and safety data sheets are up 452%.

There was a general discussion of whether this committee reviews student injuries/accidents, which it does not. The UHSC is OSHA-oriented, so covers workers. Student, visitor, guest, and volunteer accidents are reviewed by Risk Management.

Emergency Operations Plans need to be adapted for each department and/or building. The general template should be used as a starting place, and appendices may be added to address unique areas or situations. Mark Becker will be invited to an upcoming meeting to discuss EOPs.

Dan noted that Ron Adams is interested in attending an upcoming meeting; Dan will provide him with a calendar.
